


Reception Homework Autumn term (2nd half)



What is a fairy tale?

1. Share Fairy tales in story books or films. Discuss the different characters. Keep a record of who you have found out about. Which character is your favourite and why?
2. Share the story of Goldilocks and the Three Bears. Talk about why Goldilocks should say sorry for what she did to the bears. Write a sorry letter or make a sorry card from Goldilocks to the bears.
3. Make a WANTED poster so the Bears can catch the person who ate their porridge.

What shape/size am I?

Learn about shape and size:

1. Choose at least 3 of the same item in different sizes
e.g. 3 bowls, 3 chairs, 3 spoons, 3 cups, 3 shoes, 3 socks etc.
Put the objects into size order from smallest to biggest. Draw or photograph them and make a size poster.
2. Take a shape walk around your house and draw/ photograph objects that have a square, circle, rectangle or triangle shape. Can you find any other 2D/3D shapes?

What can I cook?

1. Make some bear shape biscuits.
 2. Make some porridge and add different toppings.
 3. Invent a new breakfast for the three bears.
 4. Make your own recipe book.
- Don't forget to photograph your creations.

Can you tell a story?

Create a story box:

1. Decorate an old shoe box e.g. like a forest, an ice castle, outer space, under the sea...
2. Make some scenery out of cardboard. Paint.
3. Make some characters out of cardboard or paper and colour.
4. Retell a familiar story or create your own story.
