



## EYFS Homework Activities Growth and Lifecycles Summer term (1<sup>st</sup> half)



### Communication, Language and Literacy

1. 'Sunflower' is a very long word for a very tall flower. What other words can you think of that begin with the letter 's'?
2. Write a list of objects that might be found in the garden.
3. Draw a flower and label the different parts of a flower.
4. Write a sentence about a flower or plant.

Welcome to this half term and our EYFS Learning Challenge homework challenge sheet. Pick activities from the ones suggested on a weekly basis and send them in for your child to share in class on a Friday.

This term we will be thinking about what Bill and Ben might grow in their garden? We will be focussing on how plants grow and change over time.

#### **Key Question:**

*What do plants need to grow?*

#### **Daily Reading Homework**

It is very important to listen to your child read their reading book to you every day. You could help them by asking them to look at the pictures for clues, sounding out words and talking to them about what is happening in the story.

Remember to sign their reading record everyday too.

### Mathematical Development

1. Read, write and order numbers 0 - 20.
2. Touch and count objects to 20.
3. There are 10 seeds waiting to grow in a flowerpot. If 4 seeds start to grow, how many seeds would still be waiting to grow? You can use your fingers or draw a picture to help you.
4. Write your own addition and subtraction sums (up to 20).

### Cooking fun

Make some flower biscuits/cupcakes.  
Don't forget to photograph your creations.

### Plant and Flower Hunt

Take a walk around a garden, park or outside area. What plants and flowers can you find? Don't forget to take photographs and write a sentence about what plant or flower you have found?

2. Make some scenery out of cardboard. Paint.
