


Reception Homework Spring term (2nd half)



Communication, Language and Literacy

1. Practise the 'Incy Wincy Spider' rhyme - can you make up some actions to go with the words?
2. Using the letters in the word 'caterpillar', what other words can you make? Make a list of the words you can find (e.g. tap, rail).
3. Write a minibeast fact file about a minibeast. Use a range of resources (e.g. books or internet) to find out information about your chosen minibeast.

Welcome to this half term and our Reception Learning Challenge homework. Each half term I will be sending home a homework sheet based on our learning challenge focus.

This term we have been thinking about the growth and changes with a particular focus on minibeasts. *Can you think of the names of different minibeasts?* Think about where minibeasts live and how minibeasts grow. Please send in your homework to share as you do them.

It is important to try to hear your child read their reading book to you every day. Remember to sign their reading record. The more activities you try the more fun you will have and the more your child will learn. We look forward to sharing. Enjoy.

Mathematical Development

1. Find 3 objects that are heavier and lighter. To order the objects from heaviest to lightest. Draw or photograph them and make a weight poster.
2. To count objects to 10. Then add objects together (e.g. 2 bananas + 1 apple =).
3. There are 9 ladybirds on a leaf. If 6 fly away, how many would be left? You can use your fingers or draw a picture to help you.
4. Write your own addition and subtraction sums (up to 10).

Cooking fun

Make some minibeast biscuits/sandwiches. Don't forget to photograph your creations.

Minibeast Hunt

Take a walk around a garden, park or outside area. What minibeasts can you find? Try looking under plant pots, looking on leaves or bushes. Don't forget to take photographs and write a sentence about what minibeast you have found?
