Epraise

Epraise is still very popular with recent offers such as: translating Lewis Carroll's poem *The Jabberwocky*, a Royal Family collage, a Maths '*Granny is getting younger*' challenge and a Science task investigating ultrasound. Points are being regularly awarded and students are striving to get their next coloured star pin to wear on their blazers.

Homework and effort in lessons

As I am sure your child has told you, we are having a real focus on completing homework on time and working hard in lessons. I spoke to the students on Thursday of last week and the following sanctions were introduced:

- Every time a piece of homework is not completed on time or a teacher considers not enough work has been completed, the student will be issued with a C1 (in the behaviour policy). This is recorded on our data management system and analysed weekly by myself and Miss Devlin.
- Lunchtime detentions, after school detentions, school monitoring through daily monitoring cards and the removal of epraise points are some of the solutions that may be used for those who persistently do not make enough effort.

I am sure you will want to support your child and work with the school in our aim to achieve outstanding progress.

Doddle

Doddle is being used by all members of the secondary team and checklists are in exercise books for each subject. Please go onto 'Doddle' with your child and support them to turn the 'red or amber skills' green. Resources are available and there is also a 'to do test' for your child in their area.

If you feel that your child needs extra homework then the learning checklists will give an indication of the 'gaps in learning'.

Students are being encouraged to become independent learners and they should be working and challenging themselves to 'turn green'.

Maths Challenge

Our year 7 students participated in a national numeracy morning involving 200,000 pupils across the country. The Junior Challenge took place on Thursday 28 April 2016 and involved answering 25 multiple choice questions in one hour under strict exam conditions. The top 40% of students nationally will receive a gold, silver or bronze certificate and each institution will receive a Best in School certificate. Excitingly, 1200 students (top 0.6%) will be invited to participate in the Junior Mathematical Olympiad.

As mentioned in the last Standard, the school will be holding a revision evening offering techniques and advice on how best to assist your child for 'Exam Week' beginning 20th June. We strongly encourage all parents to attend the revision evening in order to support your child with their learning and would be grateful if you fill in the attached reply slip and return it to school by Tuesday 3rd May.
