How a school should use the PE and sports premium?

Schools must use the funding to make additional and sustainable improvements to the quality of PE and sport they offer.

This means that you should use the premium to:

- develop or add to the PE and sport activities that your school already offers
- make improvements now that will benefit pupils joining the school in future years

For example, you can use your funding to:

- hire qualified sports coaches to work with teachers
- provide existing staff with training or resources to help them teach PE and sport more effectively
- introduce new sports or activities and encourage more pupils to take up sport
- support and involve the least active children by running or extending school sports clubs, holiday clubs and Change4Life clubs
- run sport competitions
- increase pupils' participation in the School Games
- run sports activities with other schools

You should not use your funding to:

- Employ coaches or specialist teachers to cover planning preparation and assessment (PPA) arrangements - these should come out of your core staffing budgets
- Teach the minimum requirements of the national curriculum - including those specified for swimming (or, in the case of academies and free schools, to teach your existing PE curriculum).

How Seva School use the PE and sports premium?

Seva School is committed to ensuring all pupils have access to extra-curricular sports and PE activities and opportunities. In phase 2 of our school development we have used our PE and Sports grant to ensure that best use is made of our developing internal and external play/sports spaces. Specialist coaches through 'Game On' have been funded to lead and support the daily PE and games extracurricular provision. Game zone activities occur daily at lunchtime. Additionally we are developing our Primary staff by funding specialist coaches to team teach PE alongside the class teacher for some classes. As a new school we are investing in a range of equipment that supports fitness, sport and competitive activities and a planned programme of sports activities during enrichment time daily; 3.15pm to 4.15pm.
