Poppy sales

Until the 11th November we will be selling poppies to support the work of the Royal British Legion, who are the national custodian of remembrance. As one of the UK's largest charities, it exists to help the armed forces community and promotes remembrance to all. As I'm sure many of you are aware the bravery and courage of the Sikhs became a mainstay of the British army until Indian independence and thousands of Sikhs fought and died for Britain during two world wars. We are selling poppies on a 'Khanda' for £1.00 (first come/first serve) each and plain poppies for 50p. There are also adult wrist bands and child wrist bands for £1.00 each.
