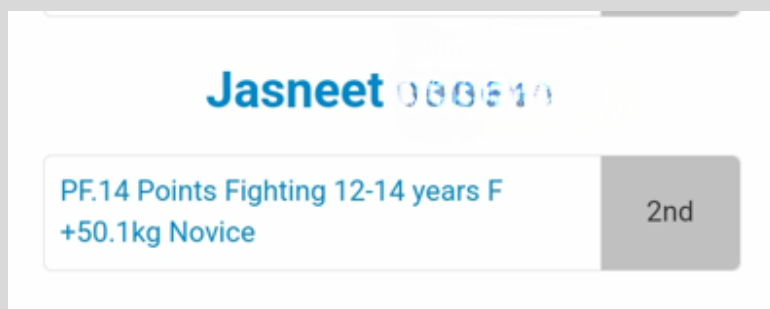

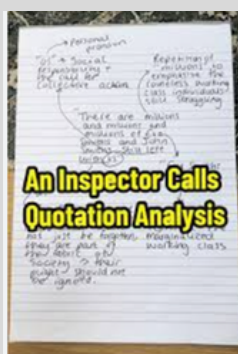

LEARNING QUOTATIONS FOR KS4 ENGLISH LITERATURE

As year 11s prepare for their exams in 2025, here are a few top tips to help them prepare to learn key quotes for KS4 English Literature. The key Literature texts are: 'Macbeth' (Shakespeare), 'A Christmas Carol' (19th century novel), 'An Inspector Calls' (Modern Drama), and 'The Love and Relationships' cluster of poetry.

- Have a good knowledge of the texts: Read the texts numerous times, ensuring you understand the plot and structure. Highlight key quotes and annotate for language features.
- Use past papers: Most past papers can be downloaded from the AQA exam boards. This can help you become familiar with the question format, improve your time management, and help identify common themes. Here are some links to past papers:

- Use post it notes: Look at past paper questions for each text. Write quotes, characters, themes, and plot points on post-it notes and rearrange them based on different exam questions.
- Use mnemonics and rhymes: Use rhymes and mnemonics to help you remember the quotes.
- Use spaced repetition: Learn short quotes and phrases as opposed to long quotes. Space out your repetition of the quotes.
- Use visual cues: Use visual cues and symbols to help you remember the quotes.
- Limit the number of quotes: Don't try to learn too many quotes. Instead, focus on learning 2-3 quotes for each theme or chapter.
- Analyse the meaning: Explore the language features, connotations of words and techniques used by the writer and their effects. Consider the literal and figurative meanings of the words and phrases in the quote.
- Consider the tone: Think about the tone of the quote and the emotions it conveys to the readers.
- Use palm cards: One side of the card, write quotes on individual cards, and on the other side write the name of the text and a word or two to indicate what the quote is about (and where it's taken from – chapter or act)

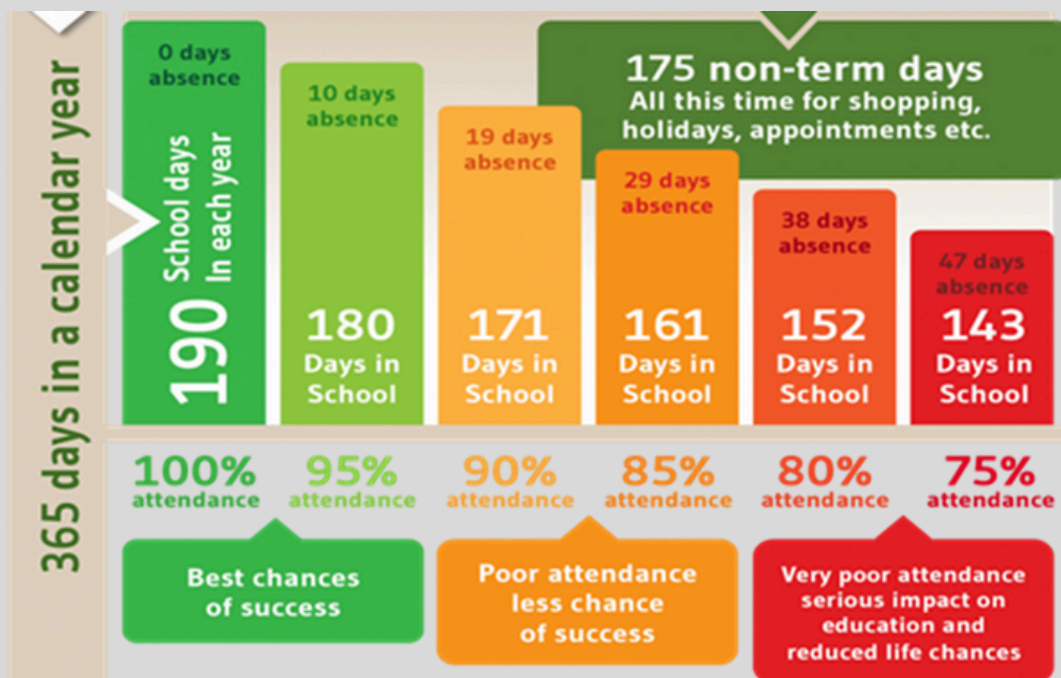

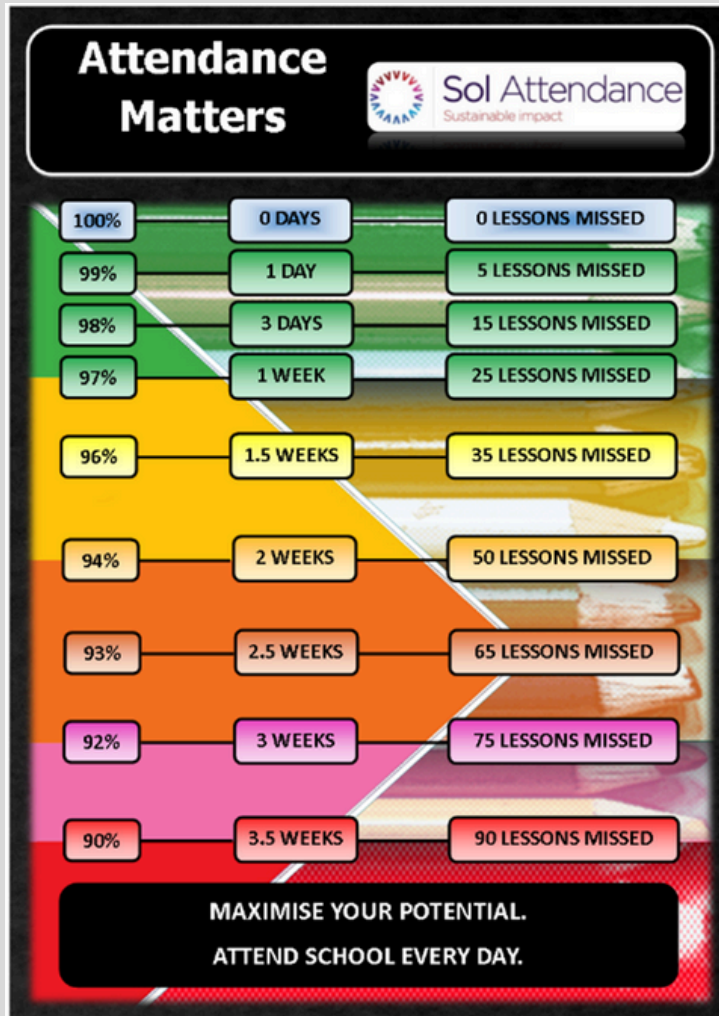

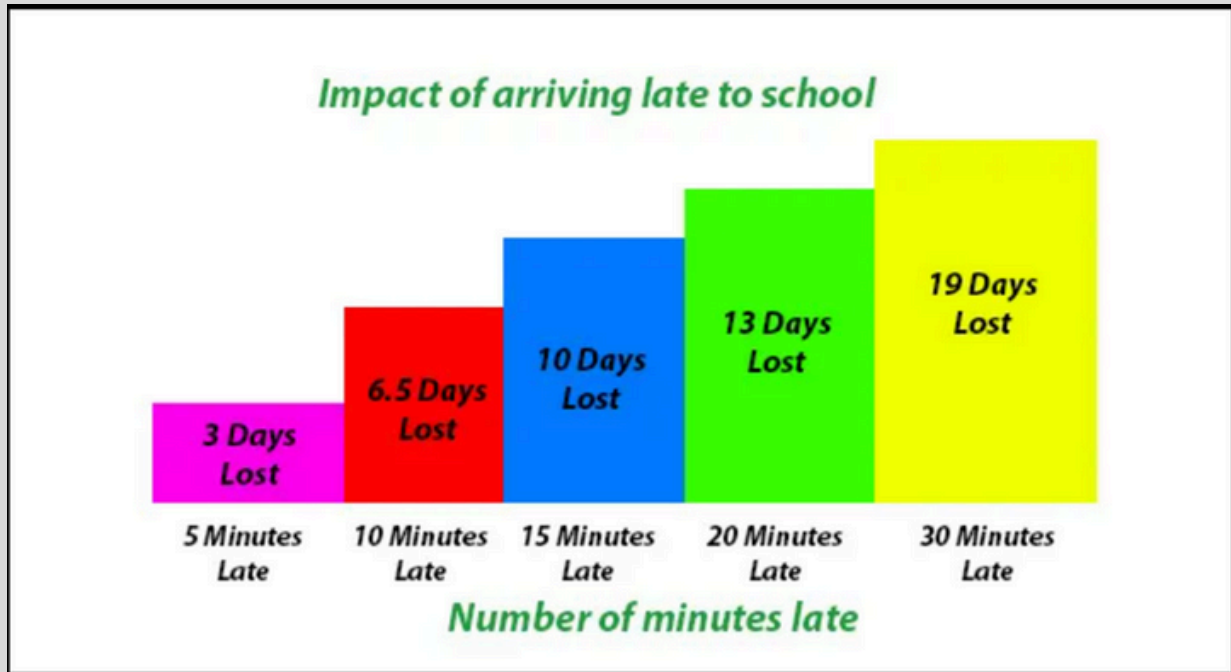
