Mrs Featherstone nominated Zorawar-Singh in Year 3 for having a positive attitude and trying hard when completing his work. Well Done.










In Seva Studies (year 7), pupils gained a deeper understanding on how a person should conduct themselves in a Gurdwara.








PUNCTUALITY MATTERS
